David is a graduate of Caledonia Community Schools (1955), attended GRJC and Western Michigan University earning a B.S in Physical Education. He earned an M.S. in Health, Physical Educa-

tion, and Recreation from Central Michigan University and also did some additional studies at Michigan State University. He taught and coached at Ottawa Hills High School for four years before moving to Grand Rapids Junior College (now Grand Rapids Community College) where he taught and coached for 28 years. At GRJC, he was the Director of Ford Fieldhouse, Assistant Athletic Director and Chairman of the Physical Education Department.

Mr. Clark enjoys the water and water safety. He was twice named National Swim Coach of the Year, and four times named State Swim Coach of the Year during his time at GRJC. He has volunteered for the American Red Cross for over 25 years

and for 20 years served as Kent County Water Safety Chairman. He established a summer program, sponsored by the Caledonia Lions Club and Caledonia Schools, to teach Caledonia students to swim, and he is still active in coaching masters swimmers and triathletes.
