

Caledonia Education Foundation Celebrates 20 Years

In 1997, Allison Hall, teacher at Kettle Lake Elementary, Mary Morgan, a parent volunteer and community member, and Superintendent Doug Busman met to discuss the value of and need for an education foundation that would raise supplementary funds for the long-term benefit of the school district. The ways in which public schools were traditionally being financed was changing and as a result, this group looked at creating additional revenues at the local levels. They also recognized that as the area and school populations continued to grow, there was a desire to maintain a sense of community that Caledonia has traditionally enjoyed and been proud of.

From dream to reality, the Caledonia Education Foundation (CEF) was formed in 1998 to address these needs and was a result of the 1997-2002 Strategic Plan for the Caledonia Community Schools District. The Strategic Plan was developed with the help of 170 community members who identified and developed ten strategies for success to pursue as a school district. The 5th strategy called for “the design and implementation of innovative capital formation programs which yielded additional financial resources to Caledonia Community Schools”.

Kathy Jackson and Mary Morgan joined with several interested community members to make up the first Board of Directors. This all volunteer board incorporated as a 501(c)(3) corporation, established policies and procedures, set up a local bank account, pursued an investment management program and set goals for a fund development program to finance the Foundation. These ladies worked hard to get the foundation up and running but were blessed in return. Kathy reflects on her time with CEF, “I found developing, maintaining and growing the Caledonia Education Foundation one of the most satisfying endeavors I've been a part of. I met incredible, hard-working and passionate people in our community that served as CEF board members, educators and students, all striving to enhance educational opportunities within our schools. In the process, many have become life-long friends.”

The Board created a logo using the trademarked school bell, representing ringing in the good news and a time to take action. Next they established credibility, name recognition, and accountability within the community, the surrounding Grand Rapids area

and with Caledonia Alumni. The foundation began an Alumni Association and kicked it off by honoring an Alumni at the Caledonia High School’s Homecoming game on Oct. 2, 1998. This started the tradition that continues today. The Foundation Fest Tailgate Event is held as a fund-raiser where community is celebrated and Alumni are

welcomed back so everyone can share in their success as well. Each year CEF honors an Alumnus that has gone on to make a difference in his/her community.

During her 6 years of service on the board from 2004—2011, Molly Fleming, Board President (class of 1985), focused on ways to educate about the Foundation and ways to give donations. She recalls, “During that time period, we placed an emphasis on donating in someone’s honor—teacher gifts, brick pavers etc... Really, getting the community involved in our purpose and mission through awareness and donation.”

Jill Harrison, class of 1985 was hired as the first CEF Executive Director in 2004. She provided needed support to this all volunteer board for 7 years. When asked what she enjoyed most, she replied, “I enjoyed working with so many intelligent, generous, hard-working, and fun people—all with a passion for our schools, our community, and creating a way to pass it on to future generations.” Jill was instrumental in establishing additional grant and scholarship funds including the VanBree Science Endowment, the Amy Barnaby

Memorial Scholarship, the Carl Workman Family Scholarship, the Millard and Eva Engle Education Scholarship, and one near and dear to her heart as it is named in her late father’s name, the Bill Harrison Agricultural Education Endowment. “It is a cool thing to be able to honor a loved one who has left us, by allowing their legacy to live on in our community. The Foundation provided that opportunity to each of these special families, each of whom had a strong connection to Caledonia, its schools, and its culture of giving back,” Jill commented.

The first Board of Directors began building an endowment fund that would continue to grow through on-going fund development. They had put in writing that one financial goal they would like to reach was a one million dollar endowment by the end of the year 2000.

The endowment fund would remain in perpetuity forever with only the investment income being spent. The majority of the investment income would be distributed to the members of the school system and/or community in the form of grants for exceptional educational

programs and initiatives that would not otherwise be underwritten by the school budget. Molly recalls, "We had a great team that focused on helping teachers understand the grant process and by doing so, we had teachers that were willing to take learning to the next level for our students. Our goal was always to create 'exceptional or above and beyond' learning opportunities for the students of Caledonia Community Schools". These grants filled in the gaps and provided funding for many start up programs such as the Caledonia Kids Theater, numerous libraries, technology upgrades such as iPads, special education tools, musical instruments, after school sewing and book clubs, and more recently Caledonia Robotics. The small grant program added three years ago, now enables teachers to apply monthly for \$500 grants that

fund smaller classroom projects such as books or teaching incentives.

From the beginning, the grant program has funded 126 grants in the district including every school building totaling over \$243,000. It took a few more years than originally planned, but the current Board of Directors is pleased to share that just recently, the CEF endowment reached **\$1,000,000!** It has been a team effort and the Board would like to thank all of the previous board members, staff, donors, school staff and administrators, and community partners for helping the foundation reach this important milestone.

As CEF looks to the future, the Board is committed to its mission statement: Creating Opportunities, Empowering our Community, and Funding our Future. They will look at the next 20 years to improve, adapt, change, update, create, and expand this foundation to meet the ever growing needs of the Caledonia schools and community in order to maintain a standard of excellence.

Meet the 2017 CEF Honored Alumnus, Mr. Bob Bergy

In this mobile age, it is rare to find families where generations grow up and live in the same community. The family of Bob Bergy, our 2017 Honored Alumnus, has roots in Caledonia dating back **100 years**. The farm he lives on turned 100 years old this past July as his Great Grandmother, Alma Bergy, purchased it in 1917. The land was farmed by his grandpa, Eugene, and his sons for many years. There are now 7 families living on the property including Bob and his wife, Cheryl, two of their daughters, his parents, his sister, and two of his nephews and their families. Bob comments, "The best thing about everyone being in the area is that the grandchildren are close by. We are available to help when they need it and no one has to travel far to get to the family gatherings. My girls enjoy being close to Cheryl and me."

Bob was born in Tacoma, WA while his dad was in the service but his parents moved back to Caledonia when he was only 4 months old. He lived in town and walked to Caledonia Elementary each day, went to junior high in the old A building that has been removed, and attended Caledonia High School in what is now Duncan Lake Middle School. He graduated in 1965 and his class was one of the largest at that time with over 100 students.

During high school, Bob was involved in Future Farmers of America (FFA) for 4 years. His teacher was Mr. Bill Harrison, another CEF Honored Alumnus. Part of the FFA class was studying about being on a team. Bob recalls, "In my senior year, I was a member of the demonstration team. Doug Fitch and I demonstrated how to milk a cow. We took 1st place at district competition, 1st place at regional's, and 2nd place at the state competition." Bob also played the saxophone for 4 years at CHS.

Throughout the summers in high school, Bob worked on a farm. In 1966 he felt the call to serve his country and joined the Army National Guard and continued until 1972. During this time, Bob started working as a mechanic for Caledonia Tractor. He spent 24 years there working in parts, rental, and sales as well as a service manager. When they went out of business in 1993, he was hired as the Branch Manager for Carleton Equipment where he still continues to work. He is not ready to retire yet as he enjoys what he does everyday!

Bob grew up in a family supported by small business. His grandfather farmed the land he lives on today and his father was the owner of the Marathon Gas Station that is now the Speedway Gas Station. Bob has worked for a Caledonia small business all of his life. When asked about his experience he commented, "When you work for a small business you have more input into how the business is run. Small businesses are often family owned and that can mean a friendlier atmosphere in the workplace. It also allows the employees more input in the day to day operations. The two companies I have worked for, Caledonia Tractor and Carleton Equipment, have both

offered that to me."

Family is high on Bob's list of priorities and having so many family members nearby means a great deal to him. He met his wife, Cheryl when she worked at the MidVilla Inn in Middleville. Bob stopped there for a burger and Cheryl waited on him. They were married in 1972 and were blessed with 4 daughters. Lori, Carolyn, Sarah, and Shari are all Caledonia Alumni. They also hosted an exchange student from Germany,

Maren, for the 1989-1990 school year. She spent her senior year with them and graduated from CHS in 1990. They consider her family and have kept in touch with her. They are blessed with 7 grandchildren ranging in age from 8 months old up to a 17 year old granddaughter who is a senior this fall at CHS.

It is evident that Bob believes in giving back to his community through service and building a better tomorrow for his grandchildren. He has been a member of the American Legion Post 305 for many years. He lived in the village for 12 years and

was a member of the Village Zoning Appeals board for 3 years.

Some of the accomplishments that Bob is most proud of include serving with 3 local organizations. Bob was a charter board member of the Sportsman's Club since it was founded in 1973 and was involved in the start up process. Bob recalls, "It was a lot of work but there was a lot of fun

throughout the process, as well." In 1975 the Jaycee's formed a Caledonia chapter and decided it would be a good idea to have a parade on the 4th of July in 1976 for the Bicentennial. A committee was formed and Bob served as co-chairman of that committee. This started a tradition that still takes place today. Lastly, Bob was elected to the Caledonia School Board in 1995. During his 12 years, he served in the roles of Treasurer, Vice President, and President.

For recreation, Bob enjoys having family over for cookouts and playing outdoor games with the grandkids. You might catch him on the family float in the 4th of July parade or out playing a round of golf. In the winter, you can find him at the Sportsman's Club trap shooting.

Bob is to be commended for his service and giving spirit. He has succeeded through hard work and effort. In the words of his proud daughters speaking about their Dad, "Bob continues to serve this community through his family, by attending his grandchildren's school functions, through his business by helping local businesses with their Bobcat needs, and through his dedication as a community member by supporting our schools and local government. Bob believes this community is a great one. Living here for **70 years** and serving this community in various ways shows Bob's love for Caledonia. One that was passed down to him and he is now passing down to his children and grandchildren. It is a love he hopes everyone can share for our area."

Katie Bork (left) plans to study illustration and graphic design at Kendall College of Art and Design in hopes of pursuing storytelling by illustrating novels.


Erican Santiago (middle) plans to study biomedical engineering at Michigan Technological University in hopes of developing medical advances such as prosthetics to help people.

2016-2017 CEF Grants Awarded

\$45,000 in CEF grant funds were able to support many programs throughout the district this past year.

Encore English 9-12 Choice Reading Program -A new library of books was purchased for high school special education students that includes appealing texts at appropriate reading levels. The books will help with reading comprehension, fluency, reading and writing skills, and literary analysis.

Daily Grind Update-Various upgraded items such as equipment and uniforms were purchased to enhance the Daily Grind coffee shop and Mary Free Bed YMCA to-go stand run by the Caledonia Transitions Program. These new offerings entice customers which allows these young adults with special needs the chance to perform and learn new job skills.

Auditorium Sound Upgrade - A new sound board and digital microphones were purchased to increase the quality of sound and number of inputs for microphones for the district auditoriums. This will enhance school productions as well as benefit the community groups that use the facilities as well.

Caledonia Odyssey of the Minds -Funds were given to help cover registration costs for the Kraft Meadow Middle School and Emmons Lake Elementary teams that were privileged to go to the Odyssey of the Mind World Finals in Lansing, MI.

LINKS Whitecaps Game - Students with autism and cognitive impairments from the Caledonia High School LINKS/ MOCI Room worked on social, independence, and communication goals while attending the Michigan Whitecaps baseball game with their LINKS mentor. Grant funds covered the bus transportation for the outing.

Wiggle Chairs -These special wiggle chairs were purchased to help support students at Dutton Elementary who have a difficult time staying focused. The chairs help students control themselves and as a result they can better engage in classroom learning.

TV Pro Technology Update -Funds were needed at the Caledonia High School to purchase equipment such as camcorders, RAM upgrade, memory cards, and memory card readers along with software in order to upgrade the TV Production equipment to high definition.

Caledonia First Lego League - Grant funds purchased start up kits and equipment to support two First Lego League teams at each of the districts five elementary schools.

Caledonia Bands Baritone Saxophone Project -A baritone saxophone was purchased for Caledonia Bands to be used by both middle schools to enable students to learn to play this cost-prohibitive instrument.

Caledonia Bands Music Stands -A small grant funded needed music stands for band students at Kraft Middle School who were sharing stands. The additional stands will enable students to view music scores better and play more accurately.

Kettle Lake Outdoor Classroom and Learning Garden -Grant funds were awarded to the Kettle Lake PTO to build an outdoor classroom and learning garden as part of the playground renovation project.



In the spring, Denise Blunk, CEF Executive Director, presented a \$15,000 grant check to the Kettle Lake Elementary PTO Officers for the Outdoor Classroom and Learning Garden that was constructed on their playground this summer. The Kettle Lake PTO has worked very hard to raise funds for their playground rebuild and CEF is thrilled to be a partner with them!
